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

1- When I create a character design, I like to use a round brush #1 loaded with the base color to create the shape of the character, this way I can check if the placement looks good or if I need to adjust it.



2 - Once I have the shape of the character, is time to fill it with the same color. You can use a chisel brush for more precision. Using the same type of brush loaded with White start creating the Christmas Hat. Change to red to finish the hat.



3 - In order to give dimension and a nice look to the design, outline each section with a darker color using a round brush #2, for the Green I use Flash Green, for the White I use Light Grey and for the red I use Plump.



4 - With the chisel brush loaded with White, draw the shape of the right eye



5 - Now is time to give definition to the design with a round brush and black color. First, let's create the eye shapes and draw the eyelashes, then draw the nose and mouth and finish outlining the full design, the face shape and the hat. To give more dimension and lighting let's use a finger dauber with neon yellow from Tag. Dab carefully the color in the Grinch's forehead and cheeckbones.



6 - In order to give a softer effect to this character let's use a blending brush. Moist the brush with a wipe so you can blend the outline with the base color. With this technique you won't have a harsh or bold line and will get a more realistic style.



7 - To make it pop, outline the entire design with the neon yellow and a #2 round brush. To embellish the design let's use stencils! I love to use them in every design as I beleive it gives a nice effect. This time I decided to use one of my favorites, Graffity Eyes from Lea Sealy, then I added small snowflakes with my own stencil's Brand, called My Stencils. this one is from my Christmas collection. To give it a final touch of illumination add some White lines with the #1 round brush to create highlights and soft them with the blending brush
