Cherry Blossom Fairy



First, I sponge on a light base. In this case I used TAG pearl lilac and a FAB dark shimmer purple.



I add double dip flowers and flower petals I keep my main flowers above the eye level to avoid the design being too heavy and add a few petals here and there to balance out the design.



I add some black line work for the branches of the tree and my stencilled details in this step. I used my Diva "Cherry Blossom Fairy" stencil. There is also some cute little cherry blossom tree branches on this stencil, which are great to add some more details and it only takes a few extra seconds. When placing the branches, I try to keep in mind the centre focal point between the eyes and also the cheek focal points so that my design will have a nice flow and look good on both sides of the face.



Magical Birdfly



First, I add a light base on the eyelid with a sponge. I then paint the body of the bird and with a one stroke I add a butterfly wing.



With a small stencil and a slightly darker colour, I add some texture on the outer edge of the wing.





For these two next steps I add some double dip flowers and green leaves around the birdfly, so that it looks like it is placed in a floral garden. I use the leaves to emphasise the flow of the design around the eye and down towards the cheek focal point.



I add some black line work with a thin liner brush, and stencil on a magical fairy looking down on our cute birdfly.
